Observations

It is late Thursday afternoon at Khulna Bible College. Our speaking sessions are finished for the day except for the evening devotional at 9:00 p.m. The attendees of the Youth Conference are out on the activity field playing "football" (soccer) and throwing Frisbees. All who are not playing are acting as spectators or fans, cheering them on.

There are 256 registered attendees for the conference, in addition to more than 30 KBC students, teachers, staff and temporary helpers. Things have gone about as smoothly and well as one could hope. The large number has strained our capacity and resources. There are people sleeping everywhere, including on the stage (pulpit) area under the canopy. We have raised a large canopy in which the sessions are held and where the guests are fed. It is working out very well.

Ben Hayes is doing an outstanding job with the keynote lessons from Joshua 24. Brenda and I have also enjoyed his company during the few "off hours" that we have. It is nice to have another English speaker with whom to visit, and even better for that to be "home folks."

Our KBC teachers have each presented lessons, as well as several Bangla preachers, most of whom are KBC graduates. All have done good jobs.

Tomorrow (Friday) is the final day, and most of the guests will depart about 5:00 p.m. or shortly afterwards. That is when the last session will end.

I have been hampered a little by a fresh head cold, which combined with excessive heat has made it mandatory that I take breaks now and again. I am improving though, and otherwise we are all doing well.

Brenda, Ben and I will arise early Saturday morning and drive to Dhaka. Our flight to Katmandu is scheduled for about 1:00 P.M. Sunday. By the time you are reading this we should be in Katmandu. Please remember our work there for the next two weeks in your prayers, and also our travel back to the U.S. October 24-25. We all miss you, and are looking forward to getting back
