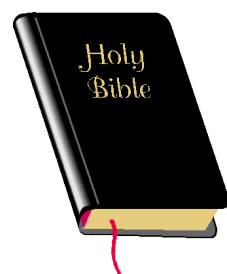

Clutch Christians

We hear so much today about “clutch athletes”. In basketball, it’s the player who, when the team is a point behind and he has two free throws, he makes them both to win the game. In football, it’s the man who makes the sensational catch in the end zone with no time left on the clock to win the game.

But, perhaps it’s most used in the area of baseball. We talk about clutch players, clutch hitters. He’s the man in the ninth inning who knocks in the winning run. He is not necessarily the best player. He doesn’t have the best batting average, but he bats 450 with men in scoring positions. This is what scouts note. He spends a lot of time on the bench, but when he gets up he makes a statement. These clutch hitters do not hit forty home runs. They are not flawless in the field. They do not get the lucrative endorsements, nor do they draw the huge salaries.

What do they do? They bring others home. They lay down the perfect sacrifice to move men from first to second, or a safety squeeze to home.

Who are clutch Christians? They are the faithful ones. You know they will be there and you can count on them when something needs to be done. They, too, are those who bring others home. Andrew would never be as outstanding as his brother Peter, but Peter may not have found Christ without his brother, Andrew. They are the ones who in times of dispute calm others down by reminding them that we are family, we are brothers. So often, like baseball, they make the managers look good. These in the church make others look good.

The common denominator in all fields is this. They love the cause. They love the team. They love the victory more than they love themselves. They are not preoccupied with who is the greatest, but rather, who will be victorious when this conflict is over. But Paul said it best: “I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the increase” (1Corinthians 3:6).
