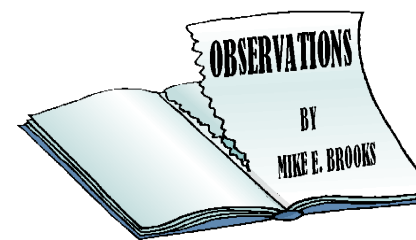

Observations



This week Philemon Halder, preacher at Ramghar and Maitaranga churches in Kagrachari district in the Chittagong Hill Tracts of southeastern Bangladesh, was involved in a vehicle accident. Thankfully his injuries were not serious and he is recovering well at home. We are thankful that the accident was not more serious. Travel is a considerable hazard here, with roads often in bad repair and many drivers not adequately trained. We keep all of our preachers and others who must constantly be on the roads in our prayers.

A lot of the schools have just completed their annual standardized tests. The students here have mandatory finishing exams at certain levels (6th grade, 10th grade, etc.) which must be passed in order for them to advance to the next level of schooling. The better the marks received the more opportunity for placement in good schools and programs. The children of some of our preachers and other workers have just received their results, and some in particular scored high on them, with "A" and "A+" grades. We "rejoice with those who rejoice" over such good efforts.

The teenage daughter of one of the local Christian ladies here had previously gotten a troubling diagnosis from her doctor. We were able to send her to a doctor known to and used by Juliet Halder this week, and this doctor gave a very encouraging report, finding no serious problems. There are some very well trained and conscientious doctors here. There are also many "quacks" that are quick to prescribe surgery or other invasive treatments with little evidence of genuine need. This was an example of a "second opinion" being very appropriate.

I was able to visit with many of the closer preachers this week as they came to KBC to receive their May salaries. They continue to report good work in their villages, and much good being done. The day they came was a stormy one, so they were not able to stay long, but quickly headed back home before their journey was hindered by weather. We have had an unusual amount of rain for April and May here. It has been welcome, as it has kept the temperatures a little lower than normal (still hot enough).

Please continue to remember Khulna Bible College and all the congregations in Bangladesh and Nepal in your prayers. You are often mentioned in prayer here.
