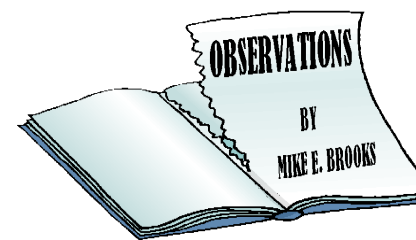

It is great to be home. Brenda and I enjoyed being at Highland Park this past Wednesday night and getting to visit with all of you who were present. We appreciated the poster on my office door from the teenagers, and the thoughtful notes left to greet us. You made us feel very welcomed and loved with you hugs and smiles and greetings. We have missed you.

Unfortunately, we will have very few opportunities to be with you in the assemblies. We are in Orlando and Lakeland, Florida today. Wednesday night (June 8) I will report at Atlas Church of Christ, in Lauderdale County. Saturday we leave for 8 days in Kentucky where I will report to at least 5 congregations. And it does not get any easier after that. I will be here most weeks for at least 2 or 3 days, and will be in the office as much as possible then. Please keep us in your prayers always.

Ibon and Juliet Halder asked that we bring you their love and appreciation. They know many of you personally and love you very much. They are also very aware of how much you do for the school and the evangelistic work in Bangladesh. They are a hard working couple who contribute greatly to the good that is being done. Highland Park has had a lot to do with their training and spiritual maturity, and with continuing to encourage them in their service in the Kingdom.

While in Bangladesh we were naturally concerned at the news of the Quran burning in Florida, and again at the news of the death of Osama Bin Laden. Only the most naïve or unaware could fail to understand the potential for violent reactions to either or both of these incidents in that Islamic nation. But things were completely quiet each time, and we were never aware of any unrest or negative reaction. Certainly we expect that the fanatics were upset, but they never posed a threat to us, nor did they make any public display of their feelings. We were extremely grateful for that.

I have already heard from both Bangladesh and Nepal since arriving home, and things continue to go well in both countries. Parsuram Sunchuri in Nepal sends his greetings and thanksgiving, as do all the workers there.

Even if you do not see us often this summer, know that we are "home" and very happy to be here. We will see you as we can.

Some Great Bible Study Resources

E-Sword Bible program is a free Bible program you download to your computer. It offers various translations and many Bible study tools such as a concordance, dictionaries, lexicons, encyclopedias, topical Bible, history study tools, commentaries and such. Most of the materials are free. Some you have to pay to download.

Christian Courier is a website by Wayne Jackson

(a preacher for the church of Christ in Stockton, California). Brother Jackson has a data base of many Bible questions he has answered down through the years. This website is great for Bible study!

Apologetics Press is a more technical website that deals much with Christian evidences. It has resources for both adults and children.

Another great resource is thebiblestudyprogram.com. This website offers a daily Bible reading schedule along with questions about the chapters you are reading. It is a 2 & 1/2 year study program that, when completed, will carry the student through the Old Testament once and the New Testament three times.

Since it is "...the Holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus," let us study the scriptures daily in order to make our calling and election sure." (2 Timothy 3:15; 2 Peter 1:10)
